Each of these awards tells part of the story. Together, they tell something much greater: Roswell Rotary showed up this year and delivered. Growth is not accidental. Impact is not accidental. Both are the result of a shared commitment to something greater than ourselves.

It was also a time to celebrate the individuals within our club whose service continues to define what Service Above Self truly looks like in action. **Lee Hollingsworth was recognized as a Polio Champion**, a reflection of his unwavering commitment to Rotary's global fight to eradicate Polio.

Alicia Hughes and Debbie Cwalina were each honored with the District 6900 Service Hero Coin, a meaningful recognition reserved for those who consistently show up, lead with heart, and make a lasting impact both within our club and throughout the community. Their passion for service is evident in everything they do, and our club is stronger because of their leadership.

Bob Hagan was presented with the Above & Beyond Award, and there may not be a more fitting name for the way Bob serves. Time and again, he quietly steps in, fills gaps, and delivers in ways that often go unseen but never unfelt. His steady presence is a cornerstone of what makes this club so special.

And then there is **Dave McCleary. Dave was recognized as the Service Hero MVP**, and this honor deserves special pause. His work in the fight against human trafficking is not only impactful; it is transformational. Through his leadership, advocacy, and relentless commitment, Dave is changing lives, restoring dignity, and bringing light into some of the darkest places imaginable. This is not easy work. It requires courage, persistence, and a willingness to confront unbelievable challenges. He is driven by purpose and a deep belief that every life has value. And while awards can never fully capture that kind of impact, this recognition as Service Hero MVP is a powerful acknowledgment of a life lived in true service to others.

That milestone represents far more than generosity...it represents lives changed across the world through clean water, vaccines, community projects, and, most importantly, hope. 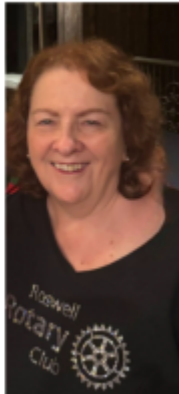

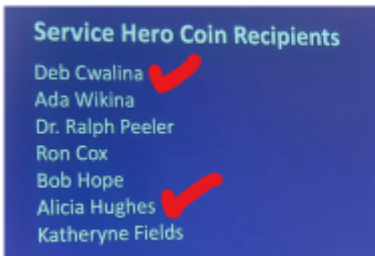
